The holiday season is upon us. It has come quick, and because of how the calendar falls (with Advent starting Thanksgiving weekend and Christmas falling on a Sunday), it will also be over before we know it. Advent is the anticipation of Jesus coming into the world. Christmas, the celebration of Jesus' arrival. Do not miss the opportunity of the season. I invite you to consider how you might play a part of Jesus coming into someone's heart.

The Christmas season is a time when many are open to an invite to church. Many people are even looking for a place to go but don't know where and find themselves too busy to figure it out. You can help! Would you consider inviting someone to Lake Shore Church? Survey after survey has shown that most people (96% in one study) who are not going to church would be *at least somewhat likely* to attend church if personally invited. I am not talking about an impersonal sharing of information, "Hey, just so you know, my church is always open on Sundays," but a deeply invested invitation, "I'd love to have you visit my church. It would mean a lot to me. Would you be open to attending with me this Sunday or next?" It's so interesting that people think offering an invite will make them look pushy when in fact it is quite the opposite. But don't just invite for their sake. Do it for you. Inviting someone to church can open up a whole new spiritual adventure, giving you new ears for what might otherwise be "the same old story." Jesus can renew his relationship with you, as you step out to invite someone new.

Check our entire church calendar for invite opportunities. We have some great Sundays planned leading into Christmas. In addition to our Sunday morning services, we have our Annual Christmas Candlelight Service (Monday Dec. 5<sup>th</sup>), Christmas Pageant and Concert (Saturday Dec. 10<sup>th</sup>), and our Family Gingerbread Bash (Tuesday, Dec. 20<sup>th</sup>). Plus, we have multiple opportunities for students through our youth program. Then, of course, we have our Christmas Eve services at 4pm and 10pm. On that night, I will be speaking about how there is room in the Jesus story for everyone.

It's a great time to become more involved at Lake Shore Church. The Spirit is loose, and people are experiencing the very presence of God. We have much to celebrate as we add new members, dream of a Second Century, and welcome our new Associate Pastor, Brendan Ashley (starting December 1<sup>st</sup>). Even so, we pray, COME LORD JESUS.


