Dear Friends:

We live in an age of intense loneliness. Studies say more people are experiencing feelings of isolation than at any other time in US history. I know that people in the church are not exempt from this experience. However, I do believe the church is well-positioned to address the epidemic and move the needle on this crisis. Making connections, building community, and joining together in joint mission is what the church is all about.

Christmastime presents a particular opportunity for us all to connect. This is the season of parties and celebrations and goodwill. It is also the season in which we celebrate God coming into the loneliness of our world. Christmas is the moment when our estrangement from God ends. He is no longer far off in another realm ruling in heaven; but through the birth of his son, God comes to be with us face-to-face. The miracle of Christmas is that God decides to be WITH us. The gift of his presence is the most precious gift of all the presents of the season.

This Advent and Christmas season, the Sunday morning series is titled, "The Gift of Presence." Not only is God present with us, but we also have opportunity to be present with our neighbors. Given what the studies are saying, we need one another's presence. One article published last month suggested that in America loneliness is impacting people of every age group. No one is immune. In fact, this study suggested that young adults, 18-22, were the loneliest age group, with 79% reporting feelings of loneliness.

As we offer presence to neighbors; we can also offer an invitation to receive the gift of the presence of God and the church. Because our culture is so heavily invested in the fanfare of Christmas, I do believe this is one of the best times of the year to invite people into church. Personal invites remain the number one reason why someone will come to church.

You will find in this Soundings the many opportunities Lake Shore Church is offering to make connections. Beyond worship, and other events, you can also invite people to get involved and serve. Letting a friend know they can participate in our gift tree may be the beginning of their relationship with our church.

CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH

On Friday, November 10, 2023, Lake Shore Church membership and friends gathered to celebrate 100 years of ministry of our church with a special Centennial Celebration Gala. The evening began out on the lawn at the corner of Jefferson & Grove Pointe where all assembled to dedicate the permanent historical marker gifted to us by the Historical Commission of the City of Saint Clair Shores. Several city dignitaries spoke at the dedication including Mayor Kip Walby. We were also given a certificate of Special Congressional Recognition by Linda Torp on behalf of Congressman James. Pastor Adam led us in The Dedication of a Second Century of Ministry call & response and spoke with excitement about the possibilities of the next chapter at Lake Shore Church. Jenna Dell sang a beautiful rendition of "Be Thou My Vision" in honor of this special event.





After the dedication, the 150 plus crowd walked downstairs to the Fellowship Hall to enjoy a delicious buffet dinner featuring a menu of Michigan products & ingredients. Blue and yellow balloons and maps of Michigan decorated the tables, while trifold displays of pictures depicting the 100-year history of Lake Shore Church sat along a wall for all to view .

The evening finished in the Sanctuary where the Saline Fiddlers Philharmonic put on a two-hour concert. These energetic high schoolers played a lively range of music from American folk to bluegrass to western swing and

beyond. All thoroughly enjoyed it, from the youngest children to the seniors.

On Sunday, November 12th, Lake Shore Church held a Dedication & Celebration Sunday. A Unity Worship Service began at 10:30am with both the Choir & Praise Band singing. Highlights of the service were several video reels of members sharing their love of our church, and their hopes and dreams for the future, and a special performance by the Children's Choir. During service, the congregation dedicated their pledges and offerings to Great Expectations (our annual campaign) and the Second Century Dream (our multi-year Capital Campaign). Pastor Adam gave an enthusiastic message giving thanks and celebrating Lake Shore's contributions to the community over the past 100 years while also igniting the flames of the next chapters that lie ahead of us and generations to come. After service, people gathered in Fellowship Hall for a Continental Breakfast.

This weekend marked the fifth and final celebration weekends we have held in 2022-2023 to commemorate Lake Shore Church's 100 -year history. A big thanks to the Centennial Team of Pastor Adam, Lin Graber, Joan Martin, Tim Thompson, Stacie Thompson, Debbie Rowe & Julie Maconochie, who gave us these wonderful events all throughout the year. We appreciate their time and hard work!

We now begin a second century of ministry at Lake Shore Church and are committed to continue the vision of that group of women who, back in 1922, endeavored to nurture the faith of children



and serve their community. We begin the second century of being a caring, growing and serving group of God's people who have an ardent desire to share the love of Jesus with others and see the power of Jesus Christ transform their lives.


