Dear Friends,

The holidays are upon us. Halloween and fall decorations have already given way to Christmas. There has been a friendly argument in our house about whether Christmas decorations are allowed to go up *before* Thanksgiving. One of our kids wants to hold the line for the sake of Thanksgiving. He won the argument at home, but in public life he is certainly on the losing side. Christmas seems to come earlier every year—even though it always arrives on December 25th!

We have some great Christmas outreach events coming up!

The first is **Cookies with Santa**. I invite you not only to attend but to invite others! This is an outward-facing community event that is sure to be filled with fun and will include the telling of the Christmas story. It's the kind of event that's easy to invite people to, and a wonderful way to offer an introduction to the Lake Shore Church community.

Later in the month, on **December 16**, we are once again partnering with Motor City Mitten Mission and Shorewood Kiwanis to host a **Christmas Dinner celebration** for families who are unhoused or precariously housed. I am grateful that, as a church family, we get to share Christ's love in such a tangible way this Christmas.

We're also making a small change to our Sunday schedule leading into Christmas. Our choir has suggested a **Unity Service** on **December 14**, and we're going to try it! They will host a free lunch following that service and invite us to stay afterward for an hour-long Christmas concert. Then, on the Sunday before Christmas, we are bringing our **Children's Pageant** into our morning worship service—the kids will bring us the message by sharing the Greatest Story Ever Told. And be sure to join us on the Sunday after Christmas, as we gather for worship, bid farewell to Pastor Brendan, and continue to celebrate the good news of Jesus' birth.

No matter where your heart is this Christmas—whether you are filled with joy or grief, weariness or energy, longing or contentment, whether you are feeling alone with nothing to do or overwhelmed by invitations and parties—I pray that your experiences with Lake Shore Church this year will help center you in the hope, peace, joy, and love that come to us not through the trappings of the season, but through a relationship with the living God, who came to us as a baby.




