Ordinary Time

"And we pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God," Colossians 1:10 NIV

Do you know what season we are celebrating in the Christian calendar? It's the little thought about and celebrated "Ordinary Time". It's the time of the year when our sanctuary is decorated with its green paraments, and if the choir was able to sing, they would wear their green stoles. Ordinary Time runs between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday, and again from Pentecost to Christ the King Sunday (Advent). This "green" season of the Christian calendar signifies it as a time of growth and new beginnings. A time to rest and renew our spirits in the Lord. In sporting terms, I would call it the "offseason"; the time to rest up, let your injuries heal, refine techniques in your game, make-over your image, re-center yourself and your priorities and prepare for the upcoming season. In the old days, the off-season was the time to indulge, slack off, and get "out-of-shape", but now athletes know the importance of off-season conditioning and training to keep them sharp for the season. In fact, how you spend your off-season reflects in how well you play during the season. I see our "Ordinary Time" off-season as somewhat of the same as in sports. Advent and Christmas; Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. These major Christian celebrations take us on emotional and spiritual highs and lows, as we go through introspective waiting, preparation, and suffering, before we experience the goodness of the incarnational birth, the joyful power of the resurrection, and the amazing gift and power of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. On the other hand, Ordinary Time is just that, ordinary. But in fact, it is the time where the focus is in how God is growing each of us! Some theologians have even suggested that the seasons of celebration are the times to evangelize by inviting friends to worship services and sharing your faith with them, while Ordinary Time is the season to concentrate on building and strengthening your own faith in God in preparation for evangelism. We are spending the first part of Ordinary Time refocusing on Christ's Mission, and Our Calling. I hope you have been reminded and reinvigorated to Proclaim the Good News of God's Kingdom, Provide for the Needs of the People, and to Protect the Most Vulnerable in Society. And we will continue the second half of the series in February as we discover how our unique SHAPE (Spiritual Gifts, Heart/Passion, Abilities/Talents, Personality, Experiences) helps us fulfill our Calling as followers and apostles (those who are Sent) of our Lord Jesus Christ.

So I ask, how is God growing you this season of Ordinary Time? Maybe you discovered a new or re-discovered an old dream that is challenging your faith this past Advent and Christmas. Maybe you have been inspired by Christ's Mission and you are striving to live it out as you share the good news of God. Friends, this is the time to embrace it and to work whole-heartedly in growing in our knowledge of God. Something that continues to speak to me is God's Call to Follow. 2020 served up curveballs and circumstances changed all around us, but through it all, God continues to call us onward. For the Chung family, that means we continue to discern where God is leading us to live and serve in the global world. We are excited about possibilities and ask for your prayers as we continue to listen for God's confirmation! In the meantime, it's been an honor and pleasure sharing our lives and our ministry with you at Lake Shore Church. I am so thankful for this season I have had at Lake Shore and for this season of Ordinary Time, as I have had the time to reflect and discern and follow Christ's Mission with you all. Ash Wednesday, Lent and Easter will be here before we know it, so soak in the last few weeks in being ordinary! Use this time before the Lenten season begins to find where the growth is happening in your lives and to nurture it as you water your soul. Grace and peace to you from Jesus Christ our Lord, in this season of Ordinary Time.
