This year Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day fall on the same day, Wednesday, February 14. The internet has marked this with memes showing foreheads with ashes shaped like hearts. It's intriguing to consider how these pictures mix the serious meaning of Ash Wednesday with the loving feeling of Valentine's Day.

Traditionally, ashes are a humble acknowledgment of our mortality - "we are dust and to dust we shall return." The cross-shaped ash signifies Jesus' sacrifice for our sins. When you receive the ashes, you are proclaiming to the world, a truth that is often shunned: our inherent sinfulness and mortality. These are difficult truths, yet we courageously confront them with the knowledge that it is Christ, not sin and death, that have the final word.

Lent begins the journey toward Jesus' death. It invites us to contemplate our own life journeys, which was recently discussed among your newly elected church leaders, is far from a straight line. Sometimes we move forward. Other times backwards. Sometimes it feels like we move in circles or are wandering around aimlessly.

This is the inspiration for our Lenten Series, "Wandering Heart." We will follow the story of Peter, one of Jesus' disciples. We see how his faith ebbs and flows as he searches and yearns for Christ. At times he shows his excitement and commitment. Other times we see his missteps and mistakes. His journey is not perfect, and neither is ours. Like Peter, through it all, we are tethered to the love of God. As we wander with Peter, we will wonder on the good news of God's love, and hopefully learn some things about ourselves along the way.

"Wandering Heart" is a worship series developed by "A Sanctified Art." This group has developed the resources that will provide a foundation for our own study. One of the things they offer to us is the theme song, "Come Thou Fount." It's a song that was written in the mid-18th century but has stood the test of time and continues to be sung not just in traditional settings but has also in modern ones. Indeed, among others, it's been sung by the likes of Chris Tomlin and David Crowder (we've sung both these versions at Lake Shore Church).

As we delve into Lent, I will align my sermons with the hymn's lyrics, (printed on the next page) exploring the parallels in our spiritual journey. I hope you will allow the Lake Shore Church to be your companion this Lent, as we journey together toward deeper understanding and connection.



CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH

I spoke to almost a dozen new members and frequent visitors this month to hear what brought them to Lake Shore Church (LSC), what they have experienced thus far, and how God is using our church and its people to make an impact in their lives. Through these conversations I learned what people are looking for in a new church, and the value of connecting with others. I want to share some of the wonderful stories I heard with you.



Nancy grew up in LSC. Her parents and their parents were members here. As a young child, she remembers going to the church nursey class in the upstairs room of the house across the street. That house is no longer on Jefferson, but her memories of that time in her life remain. In the '60's she was on the LSC girls' softball team and spoke fondly of the fun she had. She married and left the area, and then years later moved back to St. Clair Shores. About two years ago, she felt a strong need to be back in church, and on one Sunday, she found herself in the last pew listening to Pastor Adam preach. She noticed two women in front of her searching through their purses for something and heard one of them mention hand sanitizer. She offered them hers to use. They were so appreciative that the following week one of them gave Nancy a bag of candy to say thank you and invited her to join their small group. Nancy was hesitant to go, having never being involved in one before, but decided she would do it. She found the ladies in the group to be warm and kind and she kept going back. Now she wouldn't think of missing their time together of fellowship and learning about Jesus. Nancy rediscovered the church from her youth and made new friends in the process.

Jackie drove by LSC often when traveling around town, and she began noticing how many events we held outside. People looked like they were having fun and she was impressed by how we welcomed the community to these events. One day she decided to check us out on a Sunday morning. She found a welcoming pastor and congregation within the walls. She enjoys the social aspects of belonging to our church community as much as she enjoys the worship service. This was a little over a year ago, and now she happily calls Lake Shore Church her church home.

Emily enrolled her two young children in the VBS program last summer for the first time. They live down the street from the church and saw the program advertised. Both kids loved the experience! You could say that the VBS program brought the entire family of four to church as they started attending shortly after that in the Fall. The children look forward to Sunday School every week, and she has become involved in the MOPS small group. For Emily, connecting with other young moms on those Sunday evenings has been priceless.

Andrea, a woman in her 30's, was looking for a Bible-based church to attend, and when she saw the beautiful stained-glass depiction of Jesus from the street one day, she was both captivated and interested to see what our church might be like. From the moment she walked in the Welcome Center with her son she felt warm hospitality and God's presence. She said every message she hears on Sunday connects with her heart and mind. She now sees LSC as a safe space for her to continue to grow her relationship with Jesus Christ. It's a place where her relationship with him is watered, nurtured, and continues to bloom.

Meghan is in her 20's . She and her husband were in the process of looking for a church that they liked and felt comfortable in when they started coming to LSC. She told me that people here are kindhearted and friendly and that the Sunday morning messages speak to them in some way each week. They are looking forward to the upcoming Membership Matters class taking place on March 8th. She and her husband are seeking ways to become involved at LSC together as a couple. They currently attend the 9am Traditional Worship service as her husband has a fondness for the organ.

Bill, a retired engineer, said becoming involved in the Anchor Group small group was the catalyst for him becoming a member at LSC. The ability to share his thoughts and grow spiritually in a no-judgement zone was refreshing and liberating. He said, "There is no doubt that there was a piece of me that was missing that Lake Shore Church is helping me to rebuild....I deeply appreciate what the church has done for me by helping me build my faith in Jesus as our only path to salvation."

Erin, another young mother, said our church feels like family to her and that she, "Cannot say enough good things about LSC. The experience has been amazing!" One of the highlights for her family was participating in VBS this summer. She said her youngest son, age 4, is still singing the songs he learned that week in August. Both of her boys go to Sunday School, and she participates in MOPS too.

Alexis told me that after having her son in May of 2021, and experiencing some scary moments where his health was in jeopardy, it caused her to pause and realize she was missing something in her life. She grew up in a church as a child and went to Lutheran school and even went on to earn a minor in Religion at Duke University, but at that moment in her life she did not have a church to call home. Our Fall Pumpkin Patch brought her to LSC as a convenient way to pick out pumpkins since she lived across the street from the church. After meeting members and Pastor Adam on the lawn, she was interested to learn more about LSC. She started attending service, and just weeks later her mother-in-law passed away suddenly. This new church and its congregation reached out to her in her family's time of sorrow, and it moved her. She went on to join the MOPS small group, and get quite involved in various church activities including Sunday School and VBS. She told me that, "God put me in a place I needed to be, and that place is Lake Shore Church."

Renata is originally from Brazil. She and her husband were looking for a church home that was welcoming and had good children and youth programs. It's especially important to them that they lay the best Christian foundation for their children and continue what their own parents did for them as youngsters. They want their children to have a relationship with God and be part of a community. They found that here at LSC. Their son enjoys participating in the Sunday night youth program. They loved Lake Shore Church so much, that they invited her sister Andrea and her family to join them at church. Both families sit side by side every Sunday at the 10:45am Modern Worship service.

Pam, who is retired, came across our Facebook page while looking for a local church to attend. She started watching our live-streamed service on Sundays and thought immediately that, "Something about this church just feels right". When she was invited to help sell pumpkins by the host in the online chat, she felt compelled to say yes. Later, she attended in person, was baptized, and became a member. She quickly started participating in many activities such as Sunday School, Clothes Closet, and the dances. She also trained to become a CLM and is now a Deacon. She knew that she had a bigger purpose in this phase of her life, and LSC helped her see that it is serving others. Pam told me this church is, "Home for my soul."

Blessing Bags


