Dear Friends:

The story in Genesis not only describes God creating humankind as one of many species to populate the earth – but as the one species God created in God’s image. This not only gives us a special place within creation, but it also gives us a special place in God’s heart.

When I say “us,” I don’t simply mean you and me. I mean all humanity. And humanity not in a general sense, but in each human person. The term theologians have used is Imago Dei, meaning, “the image of God.” This phrase names the whole conversation around the worth and dignity of each person.

In a recent sermon, I shared my deep concern for the erosion of the Imago Dei in our public and shared life. The erosion comes in many forms and from all directions. This doesn’t mean all sides are equally guilty, only that on every side we can see how easily de-humanizing words get flung. Labeling, demeaning, name-calling, and personal attacks become steps into an ever-spiraling cycle of hatred and revenge.

The recent, widely publicized deaths in Minneapolis are beyond tragic. And in the aftermath, I have been troubled by how quickly public speech can harden—how quickly blame and suspicion can be cast, and how easily the dignity of real people can be minimized. Truth-telling matters, restraint matters, and the dignified treatment of every human being must never be treated as optional. The struggle is not only over policies and procedures; it’s also over how we speak, how we tell the story, and whether we will protect the dignity of others even when we disagree, feel threatened, or fear the worst.

As Christians we must champion the inherent worth and dignity of every human being. It matters how we treat others.... Including the immigrant (documented or undocumented), those who have committed crimes, and those who protest. It matters how we treat law enforcement and those who serve in federal roles. It matters how we treat politicians. It matters how we treat those “on the other side.” It also matters that we hold those exercising federal power to the highest of standards and to demand the dignified treatment of every human being in the exercise of state authority.

When a threat is large and people are screaming at you; “picking up your cross” can in fact seem foolish. And yet, as the apostle Paul writes, “to those who are being saved, it is the power of God” (1 Corinthians 1: 18). May we hear the call and embody this truth as we seek justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God (Micah 6:8).
