Dear Saints:

As I sit here curled up on the couch, watching my favorite Christmas movies, and taking in our first winter storm of the year (only days away from the end of our Advent waiting, and the beginning of the Christmastide celebrations), I can't help but wonder what it might look like for us to receive and enjoy the gift of Christ as we start and plan for the New Year. I also wonder what it would like if we might offer the gift of the incarnation to those closest to us: those at work, church, school, small group, home, on social media, or anywhere else we find ourselves engaged with life.

In this season of celebration, a time of enjoying the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus, the Christ, it is intriguing that studies and experts say that the month of January is the loneliest and difficult time of the year for a lot of people. In one breath, it is good news that Jesus has come during one of the loneliest times of the year. In another breath, it is confusing for some who are lost and struggling. I know for me there is something about celebrating the New Year that is a struggle. It's another year gone by, and I always wonder and reflect, "Did I make the most of another year of my life?" or "Why hasn't that relationship with my Dad gotten any better?" or "Did I carry my cross the best I could, and in the way that Christ called me to last year?" And yet, as we move forward, that tiny light shining forth from the manger comes at a time in the year, when the winter solstice has happened, when we will gain a little lighter every day until Easter, and eventually until later in the year, when we hit Summer Solstice. In last month's Soundings, Pastor Adam discussed the opportunity in front of us to invite people to join our family of faith at Lake Shore Church in the season of Advent, both to share and bolster our faith. Considering the struggle people will experience, during Christmastide, after the holidays, and leading up to Lent, it seems to me that God's call to inviting others to worship Him and entrusting ourselves to Christ is prescient.

In the lead up to Lent, we have a great sermon series on Christ's miracles. My prayer, during these cold and difficult Winter months, is that His light will work through me to point you guys to God, in the very flesh and blood, and ordinary moments of your lives. I pray that just as our Lord and Savior came, in the accessible way he did, that he would come to us using our contexts, using our experiences, using our hardships, using our gifts, using our everyday interactions to draw us closer into his presence and into the work of His Spirit.
