Soundings March 2023 - 3495

Dear Friends:

There is a sense among some of clergy that the American church may be at the precipice of a Spirit-led awakening.

This hasn't been the narrative we've heard over the last couple years. Most churches are not back to the attendance numbers they had previously and there are many churches that are actively considering not if, but when, they will close. We know that isolation, division, and individualism is so rampant in our society. But what hasn't been part of the narrative is how this is leading many into a new spiritual hunger.

I've shared previously that we have been hosting a group of St. Clair Shores pastors who are coming together for the purpose of praying for revival in our city. We are seeing the early signs. What is clear to me is that revival can never be orchestrated. But the stats are showing how this spiritual hunger is taking hold among the younger generations in America (those who were previously most absent from church). There are now more millennials reporting weekly church attendance (39%) than there were in 2019 (21%) and Generation Z, the young adults coming of age right now, may be the ones at the forefront of an awakening for the American Church.

I say this because of what has just unfolded at Asbury University. On February 8th, after a normal chapel service, a few dozen students stayed to continue to worship and pray. As other students heard, hours later, that some were still worshipping, they came to see what was going on. It wasn't long before all 1,489 very uncomfortable wooden seats in their chapel filled up. Soon after, there was standing room only. As worship continued 24/7, on February 12th, Asbury Seminary across the street opened up an overflow room. By February 14th, two more overflow rooms were opened. People were pouring in from near and far. As people came and went, over 50,000 people in total from all over the world came to be a part of it. Additionally, the movement spread to other colleges across America. Because Asbury University is in a small Kentucky town of just 6,000, the administration had to announce that they needed to wind it down. It will have gone on for over two-weeks straight.

How did it start? During a very normal worship service, the campus pastor preached on what it means to love one another. One of the students who stayed shared his heart to his peers and openly confessed his sin. In other words, it started with God's love and a confession of the heart. There is no script, no leader, no planned sermons. Even as some celebrity pastors have shown up, they were not invited to speak. It is the most organic of events. There is no human orchestrating what has happened on that campus. There is no central leader or human authority. It hasn't been flashy or loud. It has been a movement of young people repenting and turning to the Lord.

They are inspiring me as we enter into Lent 2023. I am so pleased that this word of hope came from a group of students at Asbury University. With the news from MSU, we need these new signs of hope. Any return to the LORD must start with our own confession. And so this lent, the invitation is to turn away from "Lookin' for Love in All the Wrong Places," so that we might have room for the true source of love that is seeking to find us. As we experience Him, we can share Him with the world. I hope you will join me on Sunday mornings, and I hope you will invite others. Come, ready to welcome those who are showing up with a new spiritual hunger inside of them.

News from Isaac & Misty - - - - -


Dear Lake Shore Church Family,


Spring is in the air...
