Dear Friends:

Our prayer, "Lord, how do you want me to be a part of the dream?" comes front and center this month. As we celebrate 100 years of ministry, we will each consider the impact and importance Lake Shore Church has had on our own lives. As we surface our gratitude for the way God has reached us through this ministry, we each get to wrestle with our Lord's invitation to enter a new time of increased sacrifice through our Annual Campaign and our 3-year Capital Campaign, the Second Century Dream.

The saying, "Not an Equal Share but an Equal Sacrifice" draws us more deeply into giving as we consider the sacrifices of those who have come before us. I think about those who sacrificed to bring us the beautiful facility that we enjoy today. There are a few among us who were here in 1960 when the sanctuary was built but even they were inheritors of those who had built that which had come before (including today's chapel). There are 1000s of saints whose financial support have sustained this ministry over the last 100 years.

And now, we carry forth the torch as we have each been charged with discerning our level of financial support to our shared future. I am moved by how God is already providing answers to those who have been earnestly praying the prayer. I have been told what people are being led to sacrifice. Like the couple giving up what they thought were essential household cleaning services, or the family who has decided to drive their 10-year old, 100,000 mile+ car for another 10 years, to those who are giving up trips and others who are cutting back on eating out. If God is leading you to make a sacrifice in your life in order to support this ministry, I would be humbled to hear your testimony.

As I've considered these uncertain economic times we are in, I recognize the legacy of this church which has met past uncertainty with bold plans. I think back to the building of the chapel as World War II was getting started. I think about the purchase of the organ in the early 1980s when inflation was also running rampant. I think about how this church stepped out in faith to retire its debt even though you had just called this young inexperienced and *unproven* pastor ten years ago. No matter the time or the circumstances, giving in new ways is always a step of faith. I trust that God has led us into this campaign because of the plans God has in store for this church's future!

Twice a month we pick up a van load of food from MCCSA, some non perishables, meat and produce as available. We supplement this food with food we purchase with your donations. Our clothes closet gives out clothing, shoes, household items. We are accepting clean, gently used, current season clothing only at this time. Thank you for your support and thank you to our volunteers who put in a total of 86 hours this month to keep our pantry and closet open.
