Dear Friends,

As we turn the page on this election, regardless of the outcome, we will shift our gaze heavenward and enter a season of **Thanksliving**. No, you won't be asked to give thanks for who won the election. Instead, we will focus on the countless reasons we have to thank God for all He is doing in our lives.

There is so much to be grateful for: the opportunity to work, to raise a family, to nurture friendships, to receive medical care, to love and be loved. We are blessed with shelter over our heads, food on our tables, and the gift of safety, security, and routine. We are given the gift of time — and the freedom to use it meaningfully.

These leaves will adorn our church, creating a beautiful display of God's blessings "falling" all around us.

As James reminds us: "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17).

Thanksliving also offers us a chance to reflect on our gratitude for the church. Personally, I am deeply thankful for this ministry and all it provides: the uplifting worship each Sunday, the sense of belonging in this community, the way we nurture the next generation in faith, the opportunities to serve, and the privilege of gathering in this beautiful, sacred space. Our ministry extends beyond these walls, making an impact far and wide.

On **November 24**, we will come together for a **Unity Service at 10:30** am. During worship, we will dedicate our giving estimates for 2025, commit and recommit to the Second Century Dream, and celebrate all that God is doing through our church. Following the service, we are all invited to stay for a **catered brunch**. It will be a wonderful time of fellowship as we look forward to the future with gratitude.

CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH

Hours before the semi-truck was expected to arrive at church on Saturday October 12th, Pastor Brendan received a phone call telling him the truck carrying the load of pumpkins for us would be delayed until the next day. Even though the semi was almost 24 hours late, almost everyone who signed up to help unload the pumpkins on Saturday, showed up on Sunday to help, plus a few extra people.

After enjoying a quick lunch together, about two dozen volunteers plus our pastors donned their jackets, hats and gloves, and started unloading the 100's of pumpkins off the semi into wheelbarrows, placing them on the lawn.

The Pumpkin Patch Team had already erected the large white tent, decorated the space, and taped off large areas on the front lawn so the volunteers knew where to unload the pumpkins of various sizes. It took about three hours for the volunteers to unload the pumpkins and turn the church lawn into an amazing-looking pumpkin





patch. Pastor Adam mentioned that people passing by the church noticed the great flurry of activity on the grounds and stopped in to pick out pumpkins to purchase making the first sale of the season happen before we officially opened!

This year, the newly formed Events Team — a hybrid, two-person team of Pastor Brendan & Garry Smith — met with the Pumpkin Patch Team to discuss how they could enhance this already successful event. The group discussed how to better market this event and how to increase engagement with those who visit the pumpkin patch. They decided to create more promotions, including ads in the local paper, and handing out 3x5 cards with information about community services that LSC provides: the food pantry & clothes closet, our worship schedule, webpage info, & dates of remaining events for the year.



To additionally boost personal engagement, we will hold a children's pumpkin coloring contest with three top prizes. Prizes are to be awarded after the second service on November 3rd in the Welcome Center. A separate adult lottery drawing will also take place at the same time. Adults need only to leave their contact information at checkout and be present during the drawing to win. Not only that, prayer request cards will be available at the time of purchase to show the community we care for them, and are committed to praying for them.

The Events Team has recently met with the leadership of VBS and Trunk N' Treat. They continue to collect data on all the larger events hosted by the church, and to meet with the leaders of these teams to brainstorm ideas for better marketing in the community. They also aim to create more opportunities within the events to connect with visitors and increase the potential for further engagement. The Events Team's next focus will be the Chili Cook-Off and Memorial Day Parade.
