Over the last few years we've prayed, we've planned, and we've prepared fertile ground for this moment. Now, it springs up, do you not perceive it? (Isaiah 43:19). The Future is Here.

Joyce Robinson was a faithful member of the church and was excited to be able to leave the church money in her final plans. She made the decision decades before she died and enjoyed thinking about the impact her gift would make long after she was gone. Toward the end of her life, she voiced a strong confidence in Lake Shore Church's future and our ability to continue to reach the next generation of families. Young people and the future of the church were so important to her. Interestingly, she did not have kids of her own. Her passion for the past and the future led her to naming both the Lake Shore Church and the St. Clair Shores Library's genealogy program major recipients of her estate. After her death, Joyce's gift was presented in worship by her sister Judy Wilson. It was her sisters joy to do so. Joyce had a distinguished career as a Pharmacist, graduating from Wayne State's Pharmacy program as one of two of the first female graduates.

Food Pantry & Clothes Closet

Our Clothes Closet is now accepting clean, gently used, smoke-free fall and winter clothing and household linens. We're now assisting families three times a month—77 families came through in just two hours last Monday! We receive about 60% of our food from the Macomb Food Program, with the rest purchased through your donations.
