Because we have been doing ours for so long, we have established quite a following. In fact, we had one St. Clair Shores resident ask back in August if we were doing it again. The answer is a resounding "YES!" We've been diligently planning, and the event is scheduled for Friday October 20th at 6pm. Please help us spread the word far and wide.

As always, the success of Trunk N Treat relies on the involvement of our entire church family. One of the biggest needs is for trunk participation. Pull up and pull out some bags of candy and help us share the generosity of our Lord Jesus. Trunks should arrive by 5:30pm. When our families contribute trunks, it creates a sense of VIP access for the children. It's their church plus they get to skip the line, which makes the evening even more special.

Additionally, for the third year, we will host a pumpkin patch on our Jefferson lawn. It still amazes me how the community comes out in support of this event. We hear how people are happy to buy pumpkins from us in part because of our reputation for serving the wider community. People are aware the money from pumpkin sales goes right back out. Pumpkins require a huge volunteer effort. First, on October 14th at 1pm, the truck will arrive for unloading. Then we are seeking to fill nearly 100 2-hour shifts. Talk about needing all hands-on deck! But that is what is cool about these events. These events highlight the power of faith and community coming together for a higher purpose.

It is also not too early to anticipate our "final" Centennial Celebration weekend, culminating on Sunday November 12th with a 10:30am Unity Service. The not-to-be missed weekend will kick off with our Friday night Gala from 6-9pm on November 10th. Tickets for Friday night are \$10 or \$25 for a family. They will be on sale on Sunday mornings starting October 22nd. You can also purchase right now through the church office or through our online giving platforms. On Friday night, we will be dedicating our 100-year historic marker, enjoy a "Made in Michigan" dinner, and enjoy a performance from the Saline Fiddlers Philharmonic Orchestra.

In conjunction with these celebrations, we invite your prayerful consideration of giving both to next year's General Fund as well as our Second Century Dream campaign. I have "Great Expectations" for how God is going to use the Lake Shore Church as we step into a new century of ministry. Thank you for answering the call to be a part of this incredible ministry.

CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH

On a Saturday morning back in April we gathered to discuss how God was calling us into a second century of ministry at Lake Shore Church. Our cross-generational group shared ideas about how we could reach families, kids, youth, and young adults in the coming year and beyond. After an exciting discussion where suggestions flowed, and an entire whiteboard jam- packed with various ideas, we settled on three main "dreams." In the coming days, task force leaders and teams were formed, meetings scheduled, brainstorming took place, and decisions were made to make these dreams a reality. In less than 6 months' time, we went from dreaming up ideas to concrete programs because our membership is enthusiastic about transforming lives for Jesus and committed to serving others.

One out of the three new offerings will be launched in October- Life Groups. Building Faith Friends (BFF) will start in January. The remaining Parents Night Out will be set afloat soon, with a target date of early 2024.

God designed us to live in community with one another, and that is why as humans we have a deep longing for connection. Life Groups will address our need to belong and will include the entire family. It is a new twist on the classic small groups we all are familiar with. It will create a space for families to intentionally connect, and "live life out together' while also growing together spiritually.

I spoke to Diana Tarrant, the team leader, who bubbled over with excitement while explaining how Life Groups will work. She counts herself among the many moms out there who want to get to know other families in her church community better but struggle with a busy schedule that is often difficult to maneuver. The Life Groups team consists of Kayla Daniels & Katherine Partridge who felt a calling to help Diana create something meaningful for families.

Life Groups consist of four host families who will invite two or three other families into their homes monthly to share snacks or a potluck meal while connecting, reading scripture together and growing closer to God. The cool thing about Life Groups is that it will involve the entire family. The kids will be encouraged to be part of the Bible study and it will expose them to the value of being involved in a small group.

Building Faith Friends (BFF) is scheduled to begin the first week of Jan 2024. It is a program that hopes to bridge the generational gap and build meaningful relationships within the church. The team designed a cute brown & beige brochure (that is available at church) explaining, "Our program is designed to match a senior church member with a younger member in a mentorship relationship." They have four fun activities that will take place over the coming months for these pairs, which will help partners get to know each other better and offer a space to share their faith with one another.

I spoke to Alexis Hooper, the lead, and she said BFF was born out of the relationship she had with her great-great grandmother until age 9 and a similar program she saw offered at another church two years ago. She told me that this program is important to her because she knows first- hand how much children can learn from older generations. Her team consists of five additional women who also felt this passion and calling to help – Neesha VanGorder, Ellen Sumner, Pam Boyd, Linda Demers & Debbie Rowe.

Parents Night Out, the third new program will offer parents of young children a few hours to themselves quarterly (throughout the year) while fellow church members take care of their children. There will be a meal provided and fun activities to engage in while the children are at church. Madeline Freeman is the lead, and the team consists of Alison Grosch & Michele Maksout. All three ladies believe there is a need for free child- care for little ones, where their parents know their children are safe and having fun. The team anticipates offering this important service in early 2024.



We are excited to see these innovative programs get under way and blossom at Lake Shore Church and believe they will positively impact many in our church community.


