I am shaken by the shooting a few weeks ago at Eastern Market during a Lion's game. James White, the Detroit Police Chief, was quoted as saying "tailgating, drinking, and guns, they don't mix." What started as a simple argument escalated into violence when someone pulled out a gun and started shooting. He may have ended the argument, but the cost was devastating.

Two men are now dead. One of the deceased is a relative of someone connected to the ministry of the Second Mile Center of Detroit, one of our chief mission partners. White expressed his dismay by what he described as a lack of conflict resolution. "It shouldn't have led to this," he said. It is a tragedy.

Tension, division, and conflict between neighbors seems to be at an all-time high. Instead of mutual forbearance, respect, and decency we too often see self-righteousness, indignation, and fury. As we approach the upcoming election, with the tension and anxiety that many are feeling, Christians are called to be intentional about treating one another with kindness. We have a vital role in overcoming the polarization in our country through civility and respect.

Jesus taught us that we should treat others as we would want to be treated – including those with whom we disagree. This is why I invite us all to join in the grassroots movement called "Do Unto Others." It's a call to live with humility, compassion, kindness, respect, and love as we approach this year's election. To help focus our hearts, we are launching a new sermon series with the theme verse "do unto others as you would have them do unto you" (Matthew 7:12).

The Golden Rule, as its often called, seems simple on the surface, but practicing it with true intentionality—especially toward those who are different from us—is anything but easy. Jesus knew it wouldn't be easy. Yet, he also said that loving our neighbor, alongside loving God, is the most important commandment of all.

We will kick off the series on October 6th which is also "World Communion Sunday." It's a day to recognize how the Lord's Supper unites Christians from various ethnicities, nationalities, beliefs, and practices. Communion is a powerful reminder of our oneness, even amidst great diversity. Unity and kindness toward all do not require that we all be the same. In fact, it is through our diversity that we often find richness, strength, and a deeper understanding of what it means to love as Christ loves.

Let's embrace this opportunity to rise above the divisions in our world and embody Christ's call to love one another.



CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH

MomCo (formerly MOPS) is an international organization that has chapters all over the world that are hosted primarily by churches. Its mission reads, "MomCo encourages and equips moms of young children to realize their potential as mothers, women and leaders, in relationship with Jesus, and in partnership with the local church."

Although it is technically not a small group, it has the same impact of one in that it is a place for a group of people to gather to learn and support one another. Alison Grosch leads our chapter of MomCo at Lake Shore Church. I recently spoke to her about this group to share more about it with you.



MomCo meets the second and fourth Sundays at church from 6:00-8:00pm. It is a group made up of mothers who have children ages 0-18 years old. There are about 8-10 mothers who attend on average, and currently most of these women have younger children. It is open to all mothers – not just ones who attend LSC. The two - hour sessions are based on the MomCo curriculum. This year's theme is called "Wild Hope", and the verse they are focusing on is Isiah 43:18-19 which says, "Forget the former things, do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

During the meetings, the ladies watch a short video followed by a discussion. Some evenings they have an activity such as a craft like decorating cookies. Other times, they might participate in volunteer work such as making sandwiches for a local charity that serves those without homes. The ladies in the group have become close and formed friendships that extend beyond the Sunday night meetings. They often meet at the park with their children for play dates, and they support each other in times of crisis. When one member of MomCo had their child hospitalized, the other ladies got together to clean her house and run errands for her. It's not just a group of mothers, it's a group of friends who love and support each other.

MomCo isn't just a group where mothers find community, grow in their faith, and learn to be the best moms they can be, it has also been a steppingstone for several ladies to become involved at church. I spoke to several new members and visitors this past spring who told me what a blessing this group was to them and how thankful they were that it brought them to LSC. We see God working through MomCo and its members and we are grateful for this.

Alison encourages mothers at LSC to come to a Sunday evening meeting to see MomCo in action. Bring a mom friend with you. It is a great way to make some time for yourself and it's a fantastic group to participate in.
