Food Pantry and Clothes Closet

During the month of July, we served 109 families, 275 persons. Your church family volunteered 98 hours in the pantry and closet.

Twice a month we pick up food at the Macomb County Food Program warehouse in Clinton Twp. The food is purchased through grants, donated by companies, and donated by Gleaners. All the food we get from the County is free to us. We also shop before each pantry date for all the other food we need. We are using your church financial donations for this food. Before each pantry date we pick up free bread from the Pepperidge Farm warehouse in Sterling Heights. Through these efforts we are able to give each family non-perishables, meat, dairy products, and bread products.

During our last pantry date, a man came who has only come a few times over the last couple months. He had a distinctive accent and I asked him if he minded telling me where he was from. He answered "Ukraine". I then asked him what he thought about being here in America. He responded "Safe". He and his wife are here, leaving behind all of their family. And we, as a church family, are able to give them a helping hand through our pointry and clothes closet. hand through our pantry and clothes closet.



CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH

Youth Summer Camp took place at Michindoh Conference Center in Hillsdale, Michigan earlier this month. I heard about what a fantastic time everyone had through conversations with both young people, youth leadership, and Pastor Brendan. Eleanor, age 8, who went to camp for the first time this year was asked if she would attend again, "Of course, I would go to camp again! You make a lot of new friends and have lots of fun!" She was surprised that there was a lake they could swim in (not just a pool), and even though she was a little nervous about going on the inflatable water slide the first time, it ended up being her favorite part of camp. She also shared, "I learned from Pastor Brendan that we can work together for different purposes," during one of his evening messages.

There were 31 youth this year camping. 12 of these young people had never been to camp before, and 5 of those had no formal association with Lake Shore Church. 12 adult leaders and volunteers accompanied the youth. It was the largest number of campers in the last several years. Leadership commented on how excited they were to see so many unfamiliar faces this year. It was a special joy to watch how welcoming the veteran campers were, and how they made sure the newbies felt loved and included.

What did an average day at Youth Camp look like? There are two worship sessions – one in the morning led by the Youth Leaders and one in the evening led by Pastor Brendan, Jenna, or Pastor Kevin from Canada. Both Sessions consisted of praising God by singing their favorite worship songs, and a time for discussion in small groups. A fun skit acted out by leaders combined with a leader-led message in the morning, and in the evening, the pastors presented different messages. In between the worship sessions and meals are fun group activities such as swimming in the lake, canoeing, kayaking, playing on the large lake inflatables, and games such as Flag Tag, Water Balloon Volleyball, and Earthball. Archery was offered for the first time this year and was a huge hit with the kids.

Each year the Youth Leaders gather to brainstorm and decide on a theme for camp. They create the entire program from top to bottom which is no easy feat! They choose scripture as their foundation, write the messages and skits, make costumes, and write the small group questions for each morning worship session (not to mention all the organizational tasks involved in planning camp). Their dedication to young people and God shows, and we are thankful for all that they do to make camp successful every year.

This year's theme was, "Choose Your Own Adventure." Each day a different Bible verse was tied to each lesson. They explored popular children's movies such as Finding Nemo, Cinderella, and Pinocchio while reimagining what they would look like if God were authoring them. Some of the small group questions they discussed were,

"Where do you see Jesus in our version of this story?"

"How would God create a different ending to this story, and how would the lesson be different?"


Laura, who completed her 3rd year serving at Camp, and her first as a Youth Leader, told me that she was grateful for the awesome weather they had. It didn't rain and the temperature was moderate the whole week. She thought this year having two pastors instead of one was special since it gave the youth two distinct personalities with different ways of presenting the messages, maintaining their engagement.

Emma, age 17, completed her last year as a camper this summer. She started attending camp in the 3rd grade, she recalled. She has also played in the camp band the last few years. She told me that, "Camp has always helped me open my mind and heart to new people and experiences, and has helped me grow as a Christian in my faith. I have also developed a deeper understanding of the Bible." She loved having Pastor Brendan at camp and said, "His messages helped add a lot to the theme of camp....and it was interesting to hear his personal stories and how those experiences made him into the Christian he is today." She would encourage young people to attend camp next year saying, "If you want to have the time of your life and an experience you will never forget while also learning about God, then camp is for you!"

This was Pastor Brendan's first year at camp. He gave two out of the four evening messages. One evening he spoke about how God is "Creator" and what it means to be created by God and how we can live into that. Another night he spoke about the Resurrection, and how it tied into the children's stories they studied that morning. He told me he had a blast with the kids during their free-time activities, and it was great to get to know the youth better over those several days.

Pastor Kevin spoke one evening about being all in for God, and how sometimes we need to make sacrifices. He modeled a real-life sacrifice by choosing to follow through with his commitment to the youth, and staying with them while his eldest daughter went into early labor with her first child. The baby was born while he was at camp Thursday night. He didn't visit the baby until Sunday when he returned home. Talk about turning a lesson into a real-life experience!

We are grateful to offer young people such a special camp experience at Lake Shore Church, and we know that it is God who is behind all that we do. Praise be to God!
