As we find ourselves at the end of summer and the beginning of a new fall program, I pause to give thanks to the people who empower our ministry and make up our church.

Like the old children's song, "the church is not a building...the church is the people," what I've seen this summer, is not a dormant church building, but rather a church filled with people. This summer we have gathered with old friends and met many new ones. From VBS to Food Pantry, out of state mission teams, and summer camp coming and going...the people of God have mobilized to be about the work to which God has called us.

One of the leading indicators of a vibrant church isn't a packed calendar, a large budget, or even membership totals—it's the percentage of people actively serving. Today, our Guiding Vision—refreshed for our Second Century—beckons us to be an intergenerational church passionate about raising the next generation in faith and serving our city in love.



CELEBRATING WHAT GOD IS DOING AT LAKE SHORE CHURCH:

Mission News-Celebrating Stacey and a Summer of Service

This summer was one of our busiest hosting seasons yet at Lake Shore Church! We welcomed **three mission groups over six weeks**, with a total of **114 guests** staying in our building. During busy weeks like these, the office anticipates a lot of activity in and out the doors, interruptions, and also some unexpected challenges. We give thanks for **Stacey** as she was the steady, capable presence at the heart of it. Her leadership, flexibility, and calm under pressure made an enormous difference—not just in logistics, but in keeping everyone safe and cared for.

During the week the mission group **Maine East** was with us, the building experienced **significant flooding**. We had water coming in through the drains of the Fellowship Hall and the Underground, where Maine East was keeping all of their belongings. In that moment of crisis, Stacey quickly took charge. She moved 20 people upstairs—away from the water, bacteria, and musty air—and rearranged meetings and groups to keep the rest of the week running smoothly.

She monitored kitchen and hallway cleanup, coordinated alternate dining in the Welcome Center, and stayed in regular contact with April Shields (our Mission Group Liaison), keeping her fully in the loop. Her partnership with **Greg**, the Maine East team leader, ensured the group had what they needed—and Greg expressed his gratitude repeatedly.

Pastor Adam shared a reflection last Sunday morning about Hurricane "Latrina" - the last time the basement flooded ten years ago!

"...what is amazing to consider is how 10 years ago, after "Latrina," we built back in order to be a blessing to those who were impacted by the floods of that storm. Maine East has been coming here for 10 years, and now 10 years later they became a blessing to us — jumping up to help when the floods returned. Thanks to them, we avoided the worst of the damage that might otherwise have happened. Recovery this time is a small fraction of what we had 10 years ago, and in large part thanks to them. They must have diverted 1000s of gallons considering that they were collecting water for over an hour while the storm was happening. Twenty teenagers who didn't hesitate to help!"

The **Mission Serv director** also praised our hospitality and space, calling it one of the best church hosts they've worked with. And Maine East, now a 10-year mission partner, plans to return again next summer—undaunted by the flood, and thankful for the welcome they always receive.

Of course, this summer's success took a team—thank you to **April, Tim, Dan, Beverly**, and all who supported the effort. But we especially want to lift up Stacey, who carried an extra load with grace and strength. We are grateful—for Stacey, for our mission partners, and for the ways God continues to work through our church community.

Each evening before VBS, a volunteer provided dinner for other volunteers and their families, giving them time to eat together before the program began.

Mission Project

Through Operation Kid to Kid, the children raised over \$340 to help provide warm clothing and blankets for families in North America. On Sunday at our final collection, we raised over \$520!

Kids were placed into small crews with a leader and traveled together through the day's stations:

- Sing & Play Peak (worship and music)

- Imagination Station (science and crafts)
- Glacier Games (outdoor play)
- Sticky Scripture (memory verses)

Daily Highlights

Each day included a Bible Point, Bible Story, Memory Verse, and a Bible Buddy from the Alaskan wilderness. Together they learned to "Trust Jesus"!


Pumpkin Delivery


