Church is essential! The fact that this has to be declared shares something about the church's standing in society today. Not even a generation ago, church going was a way of life, no one thought it a non-essential luxury for those who like that sort of thing.

Lake Shore Church is an essential business but this is not news to us in the church. But what about those who live around us? There is the old question, "If your church was no longer here, would the community notice?" We have always had a heart for the community and in these last two months our heartbeat has only gotten louder. New people have noticed this ministry. They have noticed our worship and our message of hope. They have heard news about our food pantry and we have not only received the community's appreciation, they have offered their support. More people now "like" our church on Facebook than we have on our membership roster.

Because of our essential work we have never shutdown. We have gotten laser focused on our mission. We haven't missed one Sunday of worship. We haven't turned away one hungry mouth. Our youth group is still meeting, we have launched a new Family Sunday School, and we have started a new small group (aka Anchor Group). Lives are being changed. We have even added to our number as we have received a new family into our membership.

God's Spirit is at work teaching us how to do ministry in this time. Sure, our worship has moved online and our building closed for a short time. But our ministry has not been on "hold." No doubt this time has been disruptive, but it is in the disruption that God speaks anew (check out the new sermon series).

Now, as stay-at-home restrictions ease, we enter a new phase. We have decided, in conjunction with local guidelines, that our building is open again for meetings of ten or less (see inside for more information). Our current challenge is discerning how and when we prudently resume in-person worship. The logistical challenges are hard enough, but the bigger challenge may be how diverse our thinking is on this. Some are eager to meet in person and are impatient to wait much longer. Others insist it's unwise to meet until there is a vaccine. There are plenty who fall in between.

Brett McCraken wrote an article titled, "Church, Don't Let Coronavirus Divide You." In the midst of differences in sincerely held convictions about resuming in-person worship, he speaks about how we might offer love in the spirit of humility to one another. As we seek to move forward in unity, we can provide a prophetic witness to our divided society. I commend this article to you.

Food Pantry will continue to operate on it's regularly scheduled dates and times as a drive-thru service. Also, during the Stay-at-Home order we will be an emergency food pantry. What that means is that a person in immediate need can call the office, and shortly thereafter, pick up a bag of groceries (in a drive thru fashion too). Please pass that information to anyone you know who may be in immediate need. Thank you.



Our building is beginning to re-open! If you have a committee, team, small group, or other group and you are ready to start gathering in person again, we want to welcome you back.

Following current guidelines, we are asking everyone entering the building to maintain social distance (6 feet), wear a mask, and keep your hands sanitized.
