How are you doing? Some of us are doing OK. Others are struggling . A few of us have been sick. Many of us know someone who has been sick. A couple of us know people who have died. Some of us are waiting this thing out at home alone and fighting the battle against isolation every day. Others are enjoying our spouses and the down-time of this respite. Others are trying to manage being together with the kids 24/7 with full-time work responsibilities and home-schooling. Some of us are on the front lines of this battle and feeling the stress and burden of it all.

Where you live certainly impacts how you experience this crisis. Being in metro-Detroit is certainly different than being up north or in a state that is so far less-impacted. I am also aware that being locked in our homes in the suburbs is a different experience than those who are living in Detroit. One member of a presbytery committee I am involved with lives and worships in Detroit and knows 15 people of close connection that have died from COVID-19.

An unknown author has stated that we are NOT in the same boat. We may be in the same storm but we are all experiencing this storm differently. There is no one way through it. There is no right or wrong way through it.

Our current series: "Anchors for the Storm," acknowledges that storms are a part of life. Sometimes the storm is little and passes in a couple days. Sometimes the storm is bigger: a marriage falls apart, a job loss, financial ruin, a diagnoses, the death of a loved one. And sometimes the storm is so big that it impacts all of society, even the whole world.

For all of the storms of life, we need strong ships that are anchored in faith and in our Risen Lord. Through the resurrection, God gives his disciples and us this grounding. As we continue in the Easter season, and as we each commit to worship and study and prayer, we will hear about the anchors God has provided. Each week I will lift up a new anchor for the storm. Now more than ever we need anchored. We need reminded of our faith.

When we are anchored we begin to experience the storm differently. We have eyes of faith instead of eyes of fear. We begin to see new opportunities to serve and to grow. This virus is not anything we can see and yet it has caused such a storm. How much bigger is our God whom the disciples did see! I praise God for he has been speaking to many of us in powerful ways during this time. Please let me know how he has been speaking to you. And thanks for continuing to join me for Sunday morning worship!

## **ANCHORS FOR THE STORM**

#### A 6-week Easter Series running April 19th – May 24th

Hebrews 6: 19: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure."

Good Friday was the biggest storm there ever was. Darkness came over the whole land. The very ground beneath them shook. The death of Jesus upended the lives of the disciples. They ended up huddled in a home. They were lost without him. But three days later Jesus found them. He showed them life when there was no life. Hope when there was no hope.

Through the resurrection, God provided them anchors – not just for the moment – but anchors that grounded them in resurrection truth that they carried with them for the rest of their lives. These anchors offer stability in every storm. Before the cross became a symbol of Christian faith, there was the anchor. An ancient sign for safety, the church used the anchor to symbolize their grounding in resurrection hope.

We all face storms in this life. Discover with us Anchors for the Storm.

We know we're all anxious to get back to "normal", and we want you to know that your Session has appointed a team to lead us safely into our reopening. There is no current time frame, just a team of your church leaders, ready to research and follow the federal and state guidelines to get us all safely back into the building together. Thank you for your patience and understanding in this matter. In the meantime . . .

Sunday morning worship services will be available online at 10am each Sunday. You can watch then or any time after that. The easiest way to watch would be to follow the link in the weekly eblast. If that option is not available to you, then go to the church website - www.lakeshorechurch.com - click on Online Services and choose the correct date.

If you have Facebook, you can go to the church's Facebook page - Lake Shore Presbyterian Church - and find the post at 10am Sunday morning. The post will premiere on Facebook and is hosted. This means it will be participatory and interactive making it the best way to worship "with" your church on Sunday morning.

Please try this before Sunday morning (you should still be able to find and watch prior Sunday services), if you have questions or issues, reach out and we can help you troubleshoot.

If you aren't connected to the internet, audio CD's are being delivered weekly.

Pastor Adam has some thoughts about worshipping virtually:



- 1) Figure out what device you are going to use beforehand (TV, computer, phone) and get it set up. The bigger the screen the better.
- 2) Get the rest of your space ready. Time to tidy up! Get rid of all distrac tions. If you aren't using your phone, silence it and put it away.
- 3) Come as you are, but remember it is still church
- 4) Get comfortable, but not too comfortable. Yes, you should get out of bed. If you are using a computer and there are two of you, get 2 chairs!
- 5) Remember that worship is interactive. Stand (if able), when it's time to stand. Sing, when it's time to sing. Pray (yes, out loud), when it is time to pray. You can now comment/like on Facebook live! We look for ward to "interacting" with you during service!
- 6) Remember we are still worshipping together. Even though we aren't physically together, we are still having the same worship experience. Start as close to 10am as possible.
- 7) Make it an experience for the whole family. Worship with the kids and be ready with alternative worship activities. The Lake Shore Church Kids Facebook group is up and available with lots of resources for the kids and the entire family.
