## **Basic Essay Skeleton**

**Directions:** If you follow these directions, you will write a good essay. The first step is to write the thesis sentence. The second step is to write the introduction sentence. The third step is to write the definition sentence. At that time, the first paragraph is complete. Then, complete the essay skeleton and make sure you have (at least) the proper number of sentences. The final step is to copy the sentences from the skeleton onto a clean sheet of lined paper. Remember to indent each paragraph at least half an inch and to check for spelling or punctuation errors. Include your name, class and hour, and the date in the upper right-hand corner. The title should be centered on the top line of the final copy.
