A Pastor Covered in Prayer

SP: What are the benefits of being a single pastor?

District Elder Hamilton: That you have more time to do the work of the ministry without the obligation of having a wife to tend to, so you don't have the challenges of trying to balance to make sure that you're giving your companion the time that she deserves and the time that she needs. Sometimes, ministry can be so demanding!

SP: What are the challenges of being a single pastor?

District Elder Hamilton: One is when you have single sisters coming to your church, you have to create boundaries because a lot of them will come. They want to be saved but they have other motives. They have an intention sometimes that they don't reveal to you. And secondly, the opposite of not having to try to balance a companion is the challenge of not having a wife. You should have support, someone who has your back, someone who can cover you in prayer.

SP: How do you set boundaries?

District Elder Hamilton: You set boundaries by number one, making sure that you do not allow females to do excessive stuff. I had to change my number because a lot of them were texting me at late hours and nights, and it wasn't anything

appropriate. It's just, they had too much excess access to me. So you have to set boundaries, even though I don't have a wife. And you have to be able to recognize that's what they're trying to do and kind of shut it down.

SP: Now you mentioned a person who covers you in prayer. How would you describe the person who covers you? What are their duties?

District Elder Hamilton: Well, I think one of the first ways is that

ladies know ladies and women are women. And a lot of the times men can be very naive as to women's motives. You may think that they're just being nice and, or you're just being nice to them. A lot of times older ladies in the church will come up and say, Soand-So, they like you, or I see Soand-So in your face. And most of the time I don't even recognize it. If I had a wife, that's probably the one of the first things that she would probably bring to my attention. Secondly, praying for me and maybe thirdly, just another thing as a pastor is a lot of times, people are not honest with you about things that you might be doing or the way you might be saying something.

And I know when I was married before sometimes my exwife would say, maybe you need to say that a little nicer, or you said so-and-so across the pulpit, or you were talking too long. Everybody has a blind side. Some people can tell you things that you need to know, but their motives are not always right. Or they don't always the best intention in telling you. Sometimes, people just want to knock you down another peg.

SP: As the single father of a 14-year-old daughter, what should other single parents know about being a parent?

Waiting for Change and Fulfilling God's Purpose

When we walk with God, it may seem nothing is changing and everything is remaining the same. I know it appears that there is no change, but trust the Word that you are changing. As you read God's Word, do you fully understand that His word is molding and shaping you into becoming a better you? The Word will tell you what isn't appropriate or the right thing to do. anything to do with the Samaritans because they had mixed Jewish and Canaanite blood; also, the Samaritans centered their worship at Mount Gerizim instead of Jerusalem. Yet, Jesus had a need to go through Samaria because of His purpose to save souls.

It was essential for Jesus to pass through Samaria because of His purpose for the Samaritans. He spoke to a Samaritan woman at a well in John 4:7-14. Jesus said, "Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life." After the Lord told her in verse 18 that she had five husbands, she was convinced that He was the Messiah. As we read in verses 28 and 29: "The woman then left her waterpot, and went her way into the city, and said to the men, Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ?"

Many Samaritans of that city believed on Him from the personal testimony of the woman who said He told her all that she had ever done. When the Samaritans came to Him, they asked Him to stay with them, and He did for two days. Many Samaritans believed because of what they heard Jesus say. They told the woman, Now we believe, not because of your saying: but we have heard Him ourselves, and know that this is indeed is the Christ, the Savior of the world (John 4:39-42).

Many unbelievers want to change but sometimes we saints allow our own personal prejudices relating to how they look, talk, act, dress, or even what they believe to cause us to refrain from telling them about Jesus. Instead of avoiding them and sharing the gospel only with people like ourselves, we should reach out to these precious hearts. God will bless your efforts with a bountiful harvest of souls saved for all eternity.

District Elder Hamilton: That it should be looked at as an awesome opportunity to help mold and develop another person's life. And that, although we have ministries, callings, and gifts that we are to give back to our church and to God, we also should take the responsibility that God has given us. The Bible said the fruit of the womb is the reward. When we start looking at that as a reward, that God has rewarded us to give us the ability to mold someone else's life, we've got to be grateful for it and make it the priority. We need to make sure that we're doing what we're supposed to be doing.

SP: What do you feel is your most important message to singles in today's church?

District Elder Hamilton: Just making sure I'm intentional and I think everybody else needs to be intentional. You must have a strategy. You have to have a system, and be willing to make the sacrifice. And I've just come to understand, this life is going to be over way quicker than we realize it's going to be over.

We just have to make every day, every moment count. And so many people are just sitting back waiting for things to happen. I was just thinking that just because we're in the church and we have the Holy Ghost and we're praying that these things that we desire are just going to come to pass, but they're not unless we collaborate with God, so we have to be God-fearing intentional! And we, as married or single saints, need to be intentional.

If you're looking for a companion, you need to be intentional about that! What are you doing to prepare yourself and to better yourself for that person to come? I am prepared quite honestly to go either way. I desire a companion, but I also am very realistic about myself that if I'm not putting the work in, or if I have issues that I'm not getting resolved, that's going to challenge me in a marital situation. Then, I might never be married again. It has a lot to do with me versus putting it on God.

SP: Okay. That's a really important thing to bring out because so often we're told, wait on the Lord and I think that's a different message that you're saying. I think it's a very important message because in the Bible, people are always doing something when God calls them; they're not just sitting around waiting.
