



### Get Ready for 31 Days of Prayer!

Greetings to All,

Peace and blessings as we approach another year of excitement! We are praising God for the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and another New Year. What better way to celebrate the New Year than our 31 Days of Prayer?

We celebrate 31 days of Prayer by our having prayer twice a day at 6:30 am (EST) and 6:30 pm (EST) during the month of January for 31 days via the phone lines. Beginning Wednesday, January 1 through Friday, January 31, 2020, we will present bishops, district elders, pastors, elders, evangelists, ministers, plus brothers and sisters to speak a word of encouragement during each session; before you begin

your day (6:30 am), and before you end your day (6:30 pm).

Each prayer session is accessible by first dialing (712) 770-4010, then entering 693336# after the prompt. The twice daily sessions begin with words of encouragement from a guest speaker; next, prayer requests are received from any individuals on the phone line; and then conclude with an all-encompassing prayer lead by the guest speaker. A prayer session may continue from 20 to 30 minutes.

Have confidence in God. Not only does He hear our prayers, but also He has assured us that He will answer them when we pray in line with His will. He hastens to perform His Word (1 John 5:14).

As singles, we want your

spiritual growth to increase and it will happen when you pray the Scriptures. Then and only then, you will acquire God's word in your situation by praying God's word. If you're sick, there are healing Scriptures. If you're depressed, or need a financial increase, pray the Scriptures. Pray the Scriptures out loud: the spoken word makes things happen! 





Our group of 140 believers was almost constantly in motion due to Dr. Hickey's highly organized schedule. I heard myself saying: "I'd rather be tired than be bored." I was never bored! The unique blend of church services, sightseeing, and dining focused mostly on vacationing, but there was also time for ministry and prayer.



My edifying experiences included meeting this Nubian gentleman who was bottle-feeding an orphaned kitten, seeing Ramses II by night in a temple full of his own statues, perusing the Step Pyramid (at Saqqara) which predated all other pyramids, realizing the Egyptian dwarfs are the forerunners of Santa's elves (!), and perceiving the masculine features of Ramses II (below)



are reflected in the faces of today's black men. Probably, other tribes wish to claim the Egyptians because these Hamites were so accomplished thousands of years go, but they were still black. To this day, the Detroit Institute of Arts isolates the Egyptian art in a separate wing from the African art, and many other institutions also duplicate this false division.

### Call to Duty for Nurses in Christ's Kingdom

The role and responsibility of a nurse is challenging, yet rewarding in so many ways. The world, including our Christian brothers and sisters, often overlooks the profession and calling of being a nurse and the duties that nurses perform. From the beginning of life and even after death, usually a nurse is there to care for the health and well-being of those whom we call our patients.

Most people have an idea of what nurses do. Odds are good that you've seen a nurse in action at some point in your life and can picture a few tasks (Flavin, 2018) or recall a time where a nurse cared for you or for someone you know.

Nurses are the ones who notice changes in patients and are often the ones who relate that change to the doctor to get help or suggest interventions to prevent death. We assess our patients and one way is by asking questions to figure out what is going on. Most people do not know that we take that information, along with any labs, x-rays, specimen reports and contact the doctor about the information we have gathered. Oftentimes, the doctor is expecting the nurse to recommend treatment



after sharing the patient data we obtained.

To make it plain, we go to bat on your behalf to get what you need to restore your health to a state that you can deal with so you can continue healing in the comfort of your own homes.

Sometimes, people are reluctant and reticent to share what is happening with them. A lot of people get scared, have attitudes, or just don't know how to explain what is going on with them. Nurses must remain nonjudgmental and not react with emotions. Perfected patience in the face of pressure daily all day long while on shift is a gift that many cannot handle. Nurses keep it cool under pressure.
