# **Worship - \$165,000**

Our Worship Task Force has set a vision for an integrated worship system that offers multiple expressions of worship—traditional, modern, and digital. This past year, our online worship had over 23,000 views. That's more than double our pre-COVID in-person numbers. Online allows our reach to become exponential. But in-person is still a critical part of our mission and in 2022 we will be returning to two in-person services. Our Task Force has made way for the Designated Associate Pastor Nominating Committee work of identifying new staff as we implement new strategies for worship and outreach to connect with people both in-person and online with the life transforming message of Jesus.

We are growing disciples through our children's, youth, and small group programs. Our church wide

# **Serving - \$85,000**

Our Food Pantry has once again served almost 2,000 persons throughout this past year. Though we haven't been able to serve dinner to guests of MCREST and MCWARM, we are able to help their works by providing sandwiches and other needed items. We help to champion the work of The Second Mile Center and are supporting them in ministry. We were able to reach out into our community through several outreach events including our Trunk N Treat where we welcomed 800

kids and our first ever Pumpkin Patch Fundraiser, which was a lot of work, but so much fun and incredibly successful! The proceeds will help to host Community Outreach events in 2022.



#### Where does this money come from?

Lake Shore Church is supported (almost) exclusively by donations. Your giving provides the means to make our ministry happen. The vast majority of this giving comes from the 90 families who offered their pledged support. Unpledged income comes from people who give to the church even though they haven't made a pledge. This year the Finance Team had to supplement the budget with the surplus from 2021 and other fund monies at their disposal to present a balanced budget.

This is how the 2022 budget information breaks down - Income Total = \$446,000 Pledged Income = \$350,000 Unpledged Income = \$60,400 Misc./Other/Presbytery Support<sup>1</sup> = \$9,600 Surplus/Funds = \$26,000
